He is a political scientist, a Senior Fellow of the Higher Education Academy and the co-editor of <i>Journal of Environmental Policy and Planning</i> . His field of research is comparative public policy. He specialises in agricultural policy reform, trade negotiations in the WTO (with a particular focus on agricultural trade and public and private food standards in global trade), relations between government and interest groups and environmental policy (focusing in particular on the politics of green taxation, agri-environmental regulation, comparative organic food policies and biofuels policy). His recent research addresses global food security policy and governance. He has published widely on these issues in leading international journals and has had four books published. He has an extensive teaching record.
