| Profile | <p>Jens Friis Lund, born 14 August, 1977. I am a political ecologist with a keen interest in equity, justice and knowledge production around natural resources governance. I have worked on participatory or decentralized approaches to forestry and wildlife management in Tanzania and Nepal, timber governance in Ghana, and economic and social issues of hunting and other recreational uses of landscape in Denmark. I presently collaborate with university partners in United Kingdom, USA, Tanzania and Nepal on governance and socio-economically oriented studies of community forestry, wildlife management, and resource related conflicts. I have (co-)supervised 11 PhD studies (5 on-going) and 23 MSc theses. I have co-edited 1 book and (co-)authored ~40 articles in international peer-reviewed journals.</p> | | | |
